- the PAC will fundraise for what the teachers need do the intermediate teachers want this?
- a literary committee and have books sent to and from the library to intermediates to have a roving library.

PAC would like Ms Lau to come and formally to present to the group on the request and the reading sets

Andrew: the PAC wants to commit funds in an equal way and will ensure that the next large amount will not go to the same groups

The group wanted it noted:

There is an interest from the PAC to invest in the students' needs but there are some concerns about the large sum, whether we are being asked for the whole amount and to what extent this is subsidizing the budget for books allocated by the school board

Dlv.1 and 2 have requested the PAC to fund the Flour Babies – Andrew and Cara made the executive decision to ask them to use their classroom funds.

Div.1 and 2 have also asked about the Teen Safety Presentation – Cara did some research about the general reception of this \$800 program and found a public funded program "TCO2" offered by the Children of the Street society.

Andrew suggested that we table all of these requests so we can get a better picture of larger requests and other programming options.

Principal's Report

Darren Mitzel

Presented the Teacher Cart to the PAC – they allow teachers to teach in the moment

Cart will be housed in the library then the second cart will go on the main floor, and then later a cart for every floor.

Designed to change the way teaching happens – no more talk and teach

Showed us the new cart and Ipads with holding containers. All will be housed in the library. All classes

The system seems to be working well and managing large numbers of devices.
